All films at the Egyptian are in the 616-seat Lloyd E. Rigler Theatre unless it is specified that the film is in the 78-seat Steven Spielberg Theatre. The Egyptian Theatre is at 6712 Hollywood Boulevard, LA, CA 90028 (between McCadden Place & Las Palmas Avenue) in Hollywood. 1.5 blocks east of Hollywood/ Highland Red Line Metro station.

Parking: The theatre validates ONLY for Hollywood and Highland, \$2 for 4 hours (each additional 20 minutes is \$1). Free street parking after 6 PM on side streets. Cherokee Avenue Municipal lot (north of Hollywood Blvd., 1 blk. east of theatre). First 2 hours \$1. Pay in advance. Cherokee/Selma lot (just east of the theatre) \$5-\$10 all day.



All films scheduled for the Aero are OPEN TO THE PUBLIC and are held in the 425-seat Max Palevsky Theatre at 1328 Montana Avenue, Santa Monica CA. 90403 (at 14th Street)

DOUGLAS SIRK: THE FAR SIDE OF PARADISE

March 1 - 4 >> Egyptian Theatre March 15 - 21 >> Aero Theatre

When director Douglas Sirk left Germany in 1937, he had already made eight films and by 1943, he directed his first American movie. Between 1944 and 1951, Sirk helmed such



remarkable efforts as THE FIRST LEGION. He signed on as a contract director at Universal in 1951, and the rest is cinematic history. Sirk was responsible for helping to mold Rock Hudson (MAGNIFICENT OBSESSION, ALL THAT HEAVEN ALLOWS, and WRITTEN ON THE WIND) into a top box office star. Sirk's association with producer Ross Hunter, gar-

nered him a reputation as a "melodrama master," influencing directors such as R.W. Fassbinder, Martin Scorsese and Todd Haynes. With IMITATION OF LIFE, his final Hollywood film, he peaked in the genre. "... craziness is very important... there is a very short distance between high art and trash, and trash that contains the element of craziness is by this very quality nearer to art." - Douglas Sirk (Sirk on Sirk: Conversations with Jon Halliday) Series compiled by Chris D.

PAUL VERHOEVEN: FILMS OF FLESH AND BLOOD

March 2 - 4 >> Aero Theatre

Director Paul Verhoeven's second feature film in his native Holland, TURKISH DELIGHT (1973), proved a popular success and set the tone for much of his later output -- super-realistic visuals, a candid frankness, a refusal to sentimentalize, bawdy humor and a low tolerance for hypocrisy. More popular films followed throughout the rest of the 1970's. THE 4TH MAN (1983) gained additional attention abroad, and Verhoeven made his first American film FLESH + BLOOD in 1985. His next three efforts, ROBOCOP, TOTAL RECALL and BASIC INSTINCT, were worldwide mega-hits. Verhoeven slowed his pace in the last decade, bringing out only two pictures, before going back to the Netherlands to realize his project about the WWII Dutch Resistance, BLACK BOOK, which will be released in the US by Sony Pictures Classics this Spring. LUC BESSON RETROSPECTIVE

March 9 - 11 >> Aero Theatre

One of the most successful French directors of the past two decades, genre specialist Luc Besson made his first feature, LE DERNIER COMBAT in 1983, followed by SUBWAY, the recipient of 13 Cesar nomina-



tions. More kudos followed with THE BIG BLUE, (winner of two Cesars), an astonishing commercial success in France Besson's international renown increased with cult action hits LA FEMME NIKITA (1990) and LEON (aka THE PROFESSION-AL) (1994). He went on to more acclaim with 1998's THE FIFTH ELEMENT,

which won him the Cesar for Best Director. In the past eight years, Besson has primarily been producing, most prolifically in the cult action genre. The upcoming ANGEL-A (released in France in 2005) and the just-released, animated ARTHUR AND THE INVISIBLES are his first directorial efforts since the release of THE MESSENGER in 1999. WERNER HERZOG, POET OF DOOM: AN IN PERSON RETROSPECTIVE
